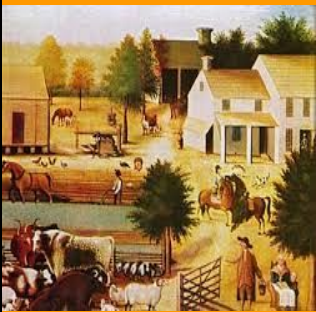


## Come Visit the *New England Colonies*

**A Proprietary Colony were ruled by proprietors- Individuals or groups to whom Britain grated land. An example is Pennsylvania.**

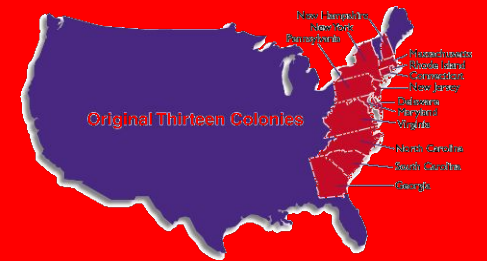


**A Royal Colony is Britain directly ruled all royal colonies. Examples are New York, North Carolina, South Carolina, & Virginia.**

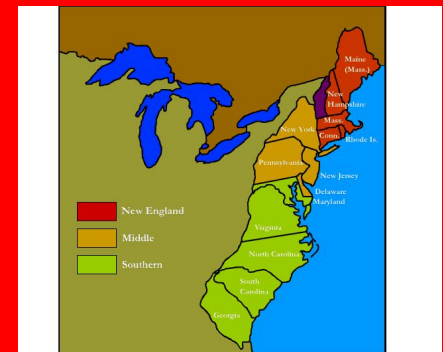

## Family Roles, Education, & Religion:

o Men were head of the house household and represented the family the community. Men performed labor-intensive work such as building barns, homes fences, and working in the fields. Young men could work as indentured servants or as apprentices.



Women ran the households and cared for children. Many worked in the fields with their husbands. Also women were under the authority of their husbands. Young unmarried women might work for wealthy families as maids or cooks.

o Most of the colonies valued education. In New England and Pennsylvania, people set up schools to make sure everyone could read and study the bible. In 1647 the Massachusetts Puritans passed a Public Education Law- each community with 5 or more homes was required to have a school.

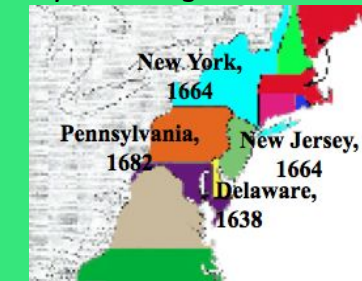
