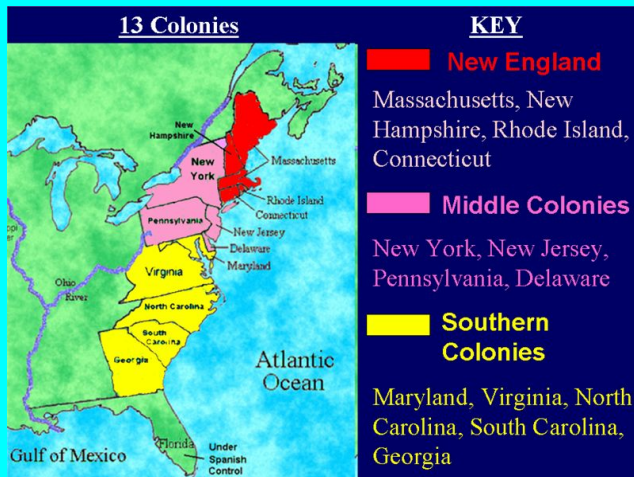


# The New England Colonies

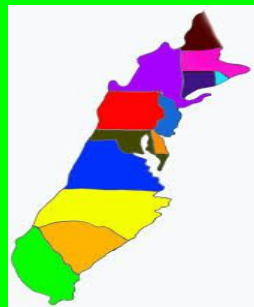
## New England Colonies:

- The names of the New England Colonies are Massachusetts, New Hampshire, Rhode Island and Connecticut.
- Economic activities of the New England Colonies and trade depended on the land that the colonists lived on. the geography and climate and had a big impact on trade and the economic activities. In the New England colonies the people made livings by fishing, whaling and shipbuilding.

# Types of Colonies

- A Charter Colony is a colony that is chartered to an individual, trading company, etc., by the British Crown. The Charter Colonies are Connecticut and Rhode Island.
- A Proprietary Colony is ruled by proprietors who were given the land from Britain. They were generally free to rule as they wished . Proprietors appointed the governor and members of the upper house of the legislature. The colonists elected the lower house. The Proprietary Colonies are Delaware, Maryland, and Pennsylvania.
- A Royal Colony is a colony administered by a royal governor and council appointed by the British Crown, and having a representative assembly elected by the people. The Royal Colonies are Georgia, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Virginia

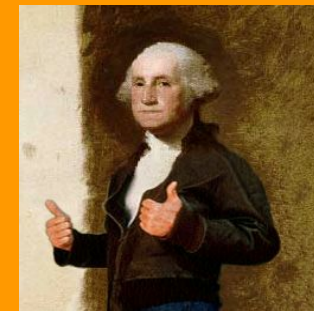
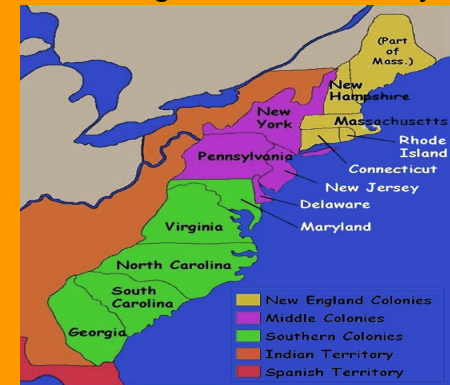

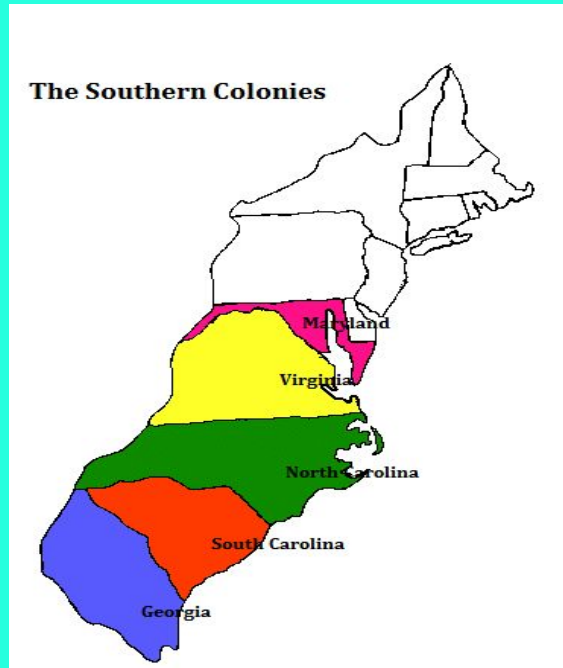

## Southern Colonies



- The names of the Southern Colonies are Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia.
- Some economic activities of Southern Colonies are exporting tobacco, cotton, corn, vegetables, grain, fruit, and livestock.
- Maryland Colony, Virginia Colony, South Carolina and Georgia Colony became states in 1788 and North Carolina became a state in 1789.

## Family Roles, Education, & Religion

- In poor households, the family unit was more responsible for the daily family household and business than in wealthier households where the business of the family was run by the fathers and they daily household chores were regulated by servants.
- People were very religious in the American colonies. Parents taught their children to read the Bible because it was often the only book they had. Children in the colonies learned many practical things from their parents.
- American colonists were very religious people. Many of them left Europe because they could not believe in their faith freely. As there were no churches people went to meeting houses to pray together.



## Middle Colonies



- The names of the Middle Colonies are New York, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, and Delaware
- Some economic activities of the Middle Colonies are carpentry, flower making, mining, lumbering, and small scale manufacturing
- The popular religions of the Middle Colonies are Quakers, Catholics, Lutherans, Jewish, and many more.
