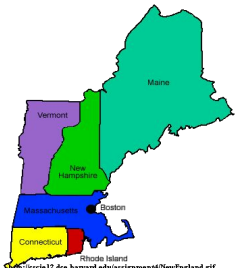


New England Colonies

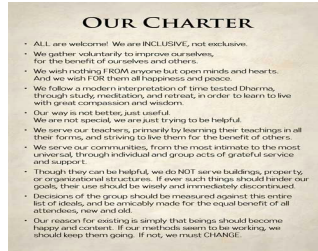

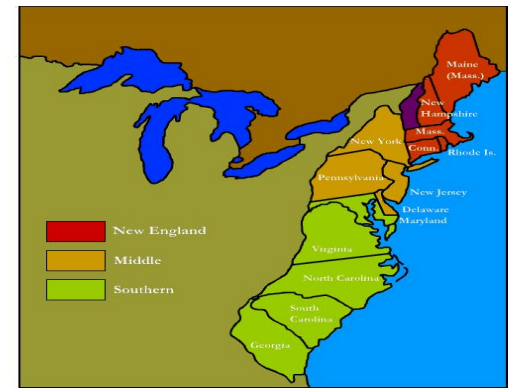
- o Proprietary Colonies are ruled by proprietors- individuals or groups to whom Britain granted land. Proprietors are free to rule as they wish. They appoint the governor and the legislature. Some examples of proprietary colonies are Delaware, Maryland, and Pennsylvania.



- o Royal colonies were directly ruled by Britain. The King appointed the governor and one part of the legislature. The royal colonies are Georgia, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, South Carolina, and Virginia.

Economic Activities

The southern colonies focused on agriculture and developed plantations exporting tobacco, cotton, corn, vegetables, grain, fruit, rice, and livestock. While working in the rice fields you had to stand knee deep in mud all day with no protection from the burning sun or biting insects.

Slaves were a big deal in the South. Virginia's slave code was a list of strict rules that governed the behavior and punishment of enslaved Africans. The list also helped define the relationship between enslaved people and free people.

Family Roles, Education, and Religion

- Some family rules in the thirteen colonies are that the men go to work and the women stay home and take care of the kids.
- In the colonies, kids are going to public or private schools. Parents believe that their kids should learn about Christianity, so they are teaching them how to read so that they can read the Bible. Schools are usually small, and kids are taught a trade.
- The middle colonies see a mixture of religions, including Quakers, Lutherans, a few Jews. The southern colonies are also a mixture including Baptists and Anglicans.



Middle Colonies

The middle colonies consist of New York, Pennsylvania, New Jersey and Delaware.

The middle colonies are more diverse than colonies in New England and the South. Most of the settlers depended on fur trade and farming for survival. Farming is very popular here and you can make lots of money off of it. A typical farm has 50 to 150 acres consisting of a house, a barn, a yard and fields. Iron ore products can be easily made here so that is another way of making a living.

In the middle colonies you can practice pretty much any religion you want to. Also there is many activities to do like go hiking in the mountains or swimming in the lakes. The middle colonies have all 4 seasons so it is a great place to live if you love all of them. There is much land to live on so it is a great life!
