The New England colonies names are New Hampshire, Massachusetts, Connecticut, and Rhode Island.

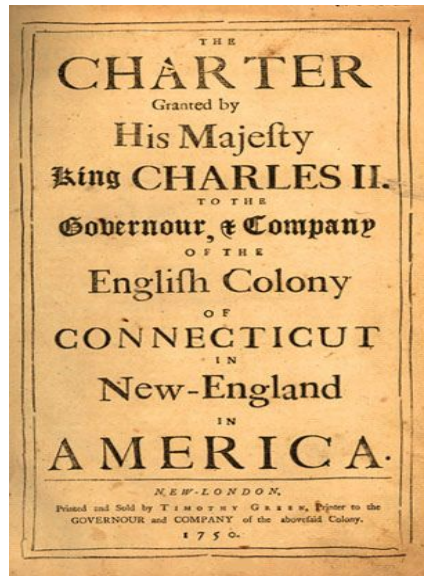
Some economic activities in New England are mills, blacksmiths, gunsmiths, shipbuilding, fishing, and soap making. Wouldn't you like one of these jobs!

## Types of Colonies

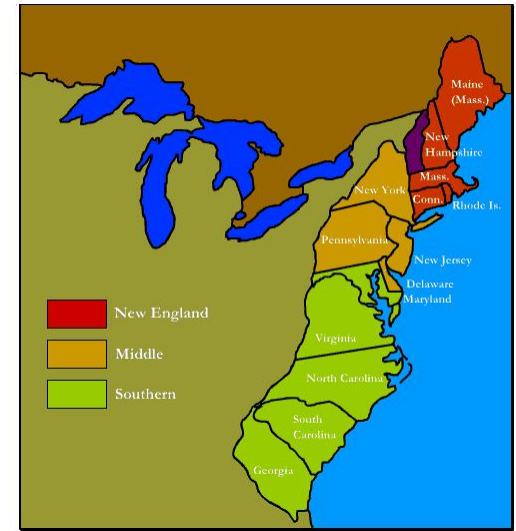
A charter colony is when settlers were given a charter to establish a colony. Some charter colonies are Rhode Island, Connecticut, and Massachusetts.

Proprietary colonies were ruled by proprietors—individuals or groups to whom Britain granted land. Examples of a proprietary colony is Delaware, Maryland, and Pennsylvania.



A royal colony is when Britain directly ruled every colony. Some examples of a royal colony are Georgia, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, North Carolina, South Carolina, Virginia.

## Southern Colonies

The names of the Southern Colonies from North to South are Maryland, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Georgia

## Family Life

Family Roles, Education, & Religion:

Family Roles-Men-head of the household and represented the family in the community, performed labor-intensive work such as building barns, homes fences, and working in the fields  
Women- ran the household and cared for children, worked in fields with their husbands, had very little rights.

Education- In New England and Pennsylvania, people set up schools to make sure everyone could read and study the Bible. In 1647 the Massachusetts Puritans passed a Public Education Law- each community with 5 or more homes was required to have a school.

Religion- The Great Awakening- a religious movement that called for a return to strong faith of earlier days.  
Two Preachers- Jonathan Edwards- People are becoming distracted  
George Whitefield- People cried, sobbed, shrieked, and fainted during his sermons.



## Middle Colonies



Here in the Middle Colonies we have the colonies of Pennsylvania, New York, New Jersey, and Delaware.
